and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Notice for longer period for the declaration of
the Minister

Customs Act 1901 - Public notice under section 269ZHG(1C)

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed a continuation inquiry of a dumping duty notice in respect of aluminium extrusions exported to Australia from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

Copies of the application and any submissions made in relation to the inquiry are available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The Commissioner provided his final report and recommendations to the then Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction on 13 May 2022. Section 269ZHG(1B)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) requires the Minister to make a declaration on the outcome of this review within 30 days after receiving the Commissioner's report. That is, by **12 June 2022**.

I consider that there are special circumstances that prevent me from making the declaration within that period. Section 269ZHG(1B)(b) of the Act provides that the declaration may be made within such longer period as I consider appropriate. Accordingly, I have extended the period for making the declaration for a further **14 days**. This means the declaration must now be made by **26 June 2022**.
