



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/037

Hot Rolled Coil Steel

Exported from Taiwan

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to Continuation No 594

Customs Act 1901 (Cth) – Part XVB

On 4 January 2022, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice initiating an inquiry into the continuation of anti-dumping measures in respect of hot rolled coil steel exported to Australia from Taiwan.¹

A full description of the goods is available in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2022/002 (initiation notice). The ADN is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (commission) website at: www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the Commissioner would publish a statement of essential facts (SEF) on the public record by **26 April 2022**.² The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction (the Minister). The initiation notice also advised that the Commissioner would make a recommendation to the Minister in a final report on or before **8 June 2022**.

In order to fully assess and verify the information provided by interested parties in this inquiry, I, Isolde Lueckenhausen, General Manager (Investigations), requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.³

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the due date to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.⁴

The Commissioner is now due to publish the SEF on the public record on or before **25 August 2022**. The Commissioner invites interested parties to make submissions in response to the SEF within 20 days of the date the Commission publishes the SEF on the public record.

The Commissioner is now due to make a recommendation to the Minister in a final report on or before **12 October 2022**.
