



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/093

Grinding Balls

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No 596

Customs Act 1901 (Cth) – Part XVB¹

On 23 December 2021, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice)² initiating a review of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice, in respect of grinding balls (the goods)³ exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China) as they affect Jiangyin Xingcheng Magotteaux Steel Balls Co., Ltd, an exporter of the goods.

The initiation notice advised that the Commissioner would publish the statement of essential facts (SEF) on the public record on, or before, 8 June 2022. The initiation notice also advised that the Commissioner would make a recommendation to the Minister in a final report on, or before, 23 July 2022.

On 8 June 2022, the Commissioner, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the due date to publish the SEF to 19 September 2022, and provide his final report and recommendation to 3 November 2022.

Due to the complexity of this inquiry and to allow time for the commission to gather data and prepare a SEF, I, Isolde Lueckenhausen, Deputy Commissioner of the commission, requested an extension of the due date for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act, extended the due date to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation.

The Commissioner is now due to publish a SEF on the public record on, or before, 28 November 2022. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the

Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

The Commissioner is now due to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister on, or before, 12 January 2023.
