



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/119

Grinding Balls

Exported from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to Review of Anti-Dumping Measures No 596

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 18 February 2022, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice announcing the initiation of a review of anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice and a countervailing duty notice, in respect of grinding balls (the goods) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China as they affect Jiangyin Xingcheng Magotteaux Steel Balls Co., Ltd, an exporter of the goods.

A full description of the goods is available in that notice, Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No. 2022/003 (initiation notice). The initiation notice is available on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (Commission) website at www.adcommission.gov.au.

The initiation notice advised that the statement of essential facts (SEF) would be placed on the public record on, or before, 8 June 2022. The initiation notice also advised that a recommendation to the Minister would be made in a final report on, or before, 23 July 2022.

Due to the complexity of this inquiry and to allow time for the commission to gather data and prepare a SEF, I, Isolde Lueckenhausen, Deputy Commissioner, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested a further extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.¹

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,² extended the deadline to publish the SEF, and provide his final report and recommendation.

The SEF will now be placed on the public record on, or before, 1 May 2023. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

A recommendation to the Minister will now be made in a report due on, or before, 15 June 2023.
