## ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/044

Accelerated Review No. 597

**Certain wind towers exported to Australia from the People's  
Republic of China**

**Notice for longer period for the declaration of  
the Minister**

***Customs Act 1901 - Public notice under section 269ZG(3B)***

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an accelerated review of a dumping duty notice in respect of certain wind towers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China, in so far as it relates to the exporter Chengxi Shipyard Co., Ltd.

The Commissioner provided his final report and recommendations to the then Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction on 26 April 2022. Section 269ZG(3A)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) requires the Minister to make a declaration on the outcome of this review within 30 days after receiving the Commissioner's report. That is, by **26 May 2022**.

I consider that there are special circumstances that prevent me from making the declaration within that period. Section 269ZG(3A)(b) of the Act provides that the declaration may be made within such longer period as I consider appropriate. Accordingly, I have extended the period for making the declaration for a further **30 days**. This means the declaration must now be made by **25 June 2022**.
