



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/098

Steel Reinforcing Bar

**Exported to Australia from Greece, the Republic of Indonesia,
Spain (by Nervacero S.A), Taiwan (by Power Steel Co. Ltd)
and the Kingdom of Thailand**

Second extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report in relation to Continuation Inquiry No 601

Customs Act 1901 (Cth) – Part XVB

On 28 March 2022, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice) initiating an inquiry into the continuation of anti-dumping measures in respect of steel reinforcing bar exported to Australia from Greece, the Republic of Indonesia, Spain (by Nervacero S.A.), Taiwan (by Power Steel Co. Ltd) and the Kingdom of Thailand.¹

The initiation notice advised that the Commissioner would publish the statement of essential facts (SEF) on the public record no later than 16 July 2022. The initiation notice also advised that the Commissioner would make a recommendation to the then Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction in a final report no later than 30 August 2022.

As advised in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) No 2022/068, the Commissioner extended the due dates to publish the SEF and provide the final report to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Minister) to 29 September 2022 and 21 November 2022, respectively.

Due to the complexity of this inquiry and to:

- allow the Anti-Dumping Commission to verify data and prepare a SEF and
- account for a reduced activity period and public holidays which occur over the Christmas and New Year period (between the SEF and the final report)

I, Mayuran Jeyarajah, Acting Deputy Commissioner, Investigations, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the due date for the Commissioner to publish the

SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.²

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901* (Cth) (the Act), extended the due date to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.³

The Commissioner is now due to publish the SEF on the public record no later than 18 November 2022 and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister no later than 20 January 2023.
