## **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2022/099**

### **Accelerated Review No 602**

### **Certain wind towers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China**

### **Notice for longer period for the declaration of the Minister**

#### ***Customs Act 1901 - Public notice under section 269ZG(3B)***

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an accelerated review of a dumping duty notice in respect of certain wind towers exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China in so far as it relates to the exporter Penglai Dajin Offshore Heavy Industry Co., Ltd.

The Commissioner provided his final report and recommendations to me on 20 June 2022. Section 269ZG(3A)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) required me to make my declaration on the outcome of this review within 30 days after receiving the Commissioner's report, that is, by 20 July 2022. However, section 269ZG(3A)(b) of the Act provides that my declaration may be made within such longer period as I consider appropriate, if I consider that there are special circumstances that prevent me from making a declaration within that period.

Due to special circumstances, I extended the period of time to make my declaration on two occasions. My declaration is currently due by 18 September 2022.

I am satisfied that there are special circumstances that prevent a declaration being made by 18 September 2022 and that it is appropriate to further extend the time for making my declaration by 30 days, that is, by **18 October 2022**.
