



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2022/121

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

2,4-Dichlorophenoxyacetic acid (2,4-D)

Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China

Findings of Continuation Inquiry No 604

Notice under section 269ZHG(1) of the Customs Act 1901

The Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (the Commissioner) has completed an inquiry into whether to continue the anti-dumping measures, in the form of a dumping duty notice, applying to 2,4-Dichlorophenoxyacetic acid (2,4-D) exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China (China). The inquiry commenced on 13 April 2022.

The Commissioner's recommendations resulting from the inquiry, reasons for the recommendations, and material findings of fact and law in relation to the inquiry are contained in *Anti-Dumping Commission Report No 604* (REP 604).

I, ED HUSIC, the Minister for Industry and Science, have considered REP 604 and have decided to accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations, including all material findings of facts and law set out in REP 604.

Under section 269ZHG(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act), I **declare** that I have decided to **secure the continuation** of the anti-dumping measures currently applying to 2,4-D exported to Australia from China.

In accordance with section 269ZHG(4)(a)(i) of the Act, I **determine** that the dumping duty notice continues in force after 24 March 2023 (the specified expiry day).

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (www.adreviewpanel.gov.au), in accordance with the requirements in Division 9 of Part XVB of the Act, within 30 days of publication of this notice.
