# **ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO 2022/097**

## **Ammonium Nitrate**

### **Exported to Australia from Chile, Lithuania and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam**

#### **Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report Investigation No 605**

*Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB*

On 8 June 2022, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice<sup>1</sup>) announcing the initiation of an investigation into the alleged dumping of ammonium nitrate (the goods<sup>2</sup>) exported to Australia from Chile, Lithuania and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.<sup>3</sup>

The initiation notice advised that the Commissioner would publish the statement of essential facts (SEF) on the public record by 26 September 2022. The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Minister) in relation to this investigation. The initiation notice also advised that the Commissioner would make a recommendation to the Minister in a final report on or before 10 November 2022.

Isolde Lueckenhausen, Deputy Commissioner, Investigations, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.<sup>4</sup> The extension was requested to:

- allow the Anti-Dumping Commission to gather and verify data and to prepare a SEF, and
- account for a reduced activity period and public holidays which occur over the Christmas and New Year period (between the SEF and Final Report).

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the *Customs Act 1901*,<sup>5</sup> extended the due date to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.

The Commissioner is now due to publish a SEF on the public record no later than **13 December 2022**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

The Commissioner is now due to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister on or before **21 February 2023**.
