



ANTI-DUMPING NOTICE NO. 2022/118

Aluminum Extrusions

Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China

Extension of time granted to issue the Statement of Essential Facts and the Final Report Review No. 609

Customs Act 1901 – Part XVB

On 8 August 2022, the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (Commissioner) published a notice (initiation notice)¹ announcing the initiation of a review in relation to aluminum extrusions (the goods)² exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China.

The initiation notice advised that the Commissioner would publish the statement of essential facts (SEF) on the public record by 28 November 2022. The SEF will set out the facts on which the Commissioner proposes to base his recommendations to the Minister for Industry and Science (the Minister) in relation to this review. The initiation notice also advised that the Commissioner would make a recommendation to the Minister in a final report on or before 10 January 2023.

To:

- allow the commission time to gather and verify data and to prepare the SEF, and
- account for a reduced activity period and public holidays which occur over the Christmas and New Year period,

I, Isolde Lueckenhausen, Deputy Commissioner, Investigations, Anti-Dumping Commission, requested an extension of the deadline for the Commissioner to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.³

The Commissioner has, under section 269ZHI(3) of the Act,⁴ extended the due date to publish the SEF and provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister.

The Commissioner is now due to publish a SEF on the public record no later than **28 February 2023**. Interested parties are invited to make submissions to the Commissioner in response to the SEF within 20 days of the SEF being placed on the public record.

The Commissioner is now due to provide his final report and recommendation to the Minister on or before **19 May 2023**.
