Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

Steel Reinforcing Bar Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China

Notice pursuant to section 8 of the Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975

- I, KAREN LESLEY ANDREWS, Assistant Minister for Science and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science, having decided to issue a notice pursuant to subsections 269TG(1) and 269TG(2) of the Customs Act 1901 (the Customs Act) in respect of steel reinforcing bar described in that notice (the goods) exported to Australian from the People's Republic of China. DETERMINE, pursuant to subsection 8(5) of the Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Act 1975 (the Dumping Duty Act), that the interim dumping duty payable on those goods be worked out:
 - as a combination of fixed and variable duty method as specified in subsection 5(7) of the Customs Tariff (Anti-Dumping) Regulation 2013.

Pursuant to subsection 8(5BAA) of the Dumping Duty Act, I have not had regard to the desirability of fixing a lesser amount of interim dumping duty, in light of the fact that the normal value of the goods was not ascertained under subsection 269TAC(1) of the Customs Act because of the operation of subsection 269TAC(2)(a)(ii) of the Customs Act.

This notice applies to the goods and like goods entered for home consumption on and after 21 December 2015.
