



Exemption Inquiry EX0081

Aluminium Extrusions

Exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China, the Socialist Republic of Vietnam, and Malaysia

File note – Revised goods description

This file note is to advise interested parties of a change to the exemption goods description in respect of EX0081. EX0081 follows an application for an exemption from anti-dumping measures by Adrad Pty Ltd (Adrad, the applicant).¹

Exemption goods description submitted by the applicant and notified in Anti-Dumping Notice (ADN) 2021/058²

The exemption goods described in the application and notified in ADN 2021/058 were:

Aluminium extrusions produced via an extrusion process manufactured from alloy number AA 3003.

Reason for change to exemption goods description

As part of this exemption inquiry, Capral Limited (Capral) submitted that a change to the exemption goods description was appropriate.³ The Commission confirmed that Adrad consented to a revised exemption goods description proposed by Capral.

The Commission will make a recommendation to the Minister using the revised goods description. The Commission's basis for this is that the applicant consented to the revised goods description, and because it narrows the scope of the exemption inquiry to more closely capture the particular goods that the applicant claims are not available in Australia. The revised exemption goods description is below.

Revised exemption goods description for EX0081

Hollow aluminium extrusions of alloy AA 3003, with a profile or cross-section which fits within a circle having a diameter of less than 155 mm.
