



Anti-Dumping Notice No. 2022/079

Resumption of International Onsite Verifications

On 20 March 2020, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, onsite exporter verifications were suspended in the interest of the health and welfare of staff within the Anti-Dumping Commission (the commission) and that of exporters and their representatives. Governments around the world, including Australia, imposed international travel restrictions and stricter entry requirements. These restrictions and requirements have eased in many countries.

The commission considers that it is appropriate to recommence onsite exporter verification on a case-by-case basis, utilising a risk-based approach to consider whether it is beneficial and safe in each instance. Onsite verifications will, among other things, seek to balance the importance of onsite verification to establishing relevant facts in anti-dumping cases and the risks associated with international travel for commission staff.

The commission will maintain virtual exporter verifications as part of the suite of possible verification options available for case teams to assess the completeness, relevance and accuracy of data submitted to the commission.
