Notice under section 269ZZM(4)

Grinding Balls exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel ("ADRP") has completed a review of a decision made by me to publish a notice under subsection 269TG(1) and 269TG(2) and subsection 269TJ(2) of the *Customs Act 1901* to impose dumping duties on the export of ferrous grinding balls from the People's Republic of China. This decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission ("ADC") website on 9 September 2016 ("the Reviewable Decision").

Applications for review were made by:

- Chiangshu Longte Grinding Ball Co., Ltd;
- Jiangsu CP Xingcheng Special Steel Co., Ltd;
- Anhui Sanfang New Material Technology Co., Ltd; and
- Commonwealth Steel Company Pty Ltd (trading as Moly-Cop Mining Consumables Waratah Steel Mill).

The ADRP has recommended that I affirm the reviewable decision.

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science, and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science, have considered and accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations made by the ADRP, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in ADRP Report No 47.

Therefore, in accordance with section 269ZZM(1) of the *Customs Act 1901*, I **affirm** the Reviewable Decision.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Federal Court of Australia, in accordance with the requirements in the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977*, within 28 days of the publication of this notice.
