Notice under section 269ZZM(4)

Resealable Can End Closures Exported from Malaysia, the Republic of the Philippines and the Republic of Singapore

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel ("ADRP") has completed a review of a decision by the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science to issue a notice under subsections 269TG(1) and TG(2) of the *Customs Act 1901* ("the Act") to impose dumping duties in relation to Resealable Can End Closures Exported from Malaysia, the Republic of the Philippines and the Republic of Singapore ("Reviewable Decision"). The Reviewable Decision was published on 24 March 2017 (ADN 2017/20).

The ADRP has recommended that I:

• Affirm the reviewable decision pursuant to s 269ZZK of the *Customs Act 1901*.
