## Notice under section 269ZZM(1B)

## A4 Copy Paper Exported from the Federative Republic of Brazil, the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Indonesia and the Kingdom of Thailand

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of the decision made by the former Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science to publish dumping duty notices under subsections 269TG(1) & (2) and subsections 269TJ(1) & (2) of the *Customs Act 1901* in respect of A4 Copy Paper exported from the Federative Republic of Brazil, the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Indonesia and the Kingdom of Thailand.

The ADRP provided its report and recommendations to me on 10 January 2018.

Subsection 269ZZM(1A) of the *Customs Act 1901* requires that I make a decision having regard to that report and its recommendations within 30 days after receiving that report. This required me to make my decision by 9 February 2018. However, where special circumstances prevent my decision being made within the 30 day period, it may be made within a longer period, as I consider appropriate.

As a result of special circumstances, I decided under section 269ZZM(1A)(b) of the *Customs Act* 1901 to extend the period for making my decision to 12 March 2018.
