Notice under section 269ZZM(4)

Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam and Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from Malaysia

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of the decisions by the former Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science to publish notices under subsections 269TG(1) & (2) and subsections 269TJ(1) & (2) of the *Customs Act 1901* in respect of Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam and Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from Malaysia (the Reviewable Decisions). The Reviewable Decisions were published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 27 June 2017 (<u>ADN 2017/72</u> & <u>ADN 2017/73</u>).

Applications for review were made by the following:

- Global Vietnam Aluminium Company Limited;
- EverPress Aluminium Industries Sdn Bhd; and
- Capral Limited.

The ADRP has recommended that I affirm the Reviewable Decision.
