Notice under section 269ZZM(4)

Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of the decision by the former Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science to publish a notice under subsection 269ZDB(1)(a)(iii) of the *Customs Act 1901* altering the variable factors relevant to the determination of the dumping and countervailing duties in respect of Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from the People's Republic of China. The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 10 November 2017 (<u>ADN 2017/138</u>).

An application for review was made by Press Metal International Ltd.

The ADRP has recommended that I affirm the Reviewable Decision.

I, ZED SESELJA, Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation/Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Jobs and Innovation have considered and accepted the recommendations, and reasons for the recommendations, made by the ADRP in ADRP Report No 69, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in ADRP Report No 69.

Therefore, in accordance with section 269ZZM(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* I **affirm** the reviewable decision.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Federal Court of Australia, in accordance with the requirements in the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977*, within 28 days of the publication of this notice.
