## Notice under section 269ZZI

## Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported to Australia from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) received an application from Press Metal International Ltd ("PMI") for review of a decision by the former Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science and Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science ("Minister") to publish a notice (ADN 2017/138) altering the variable factors relevant to the determination of dumping duty and countervailing duties, such that the fixed rate of combined interim dumping duty and countervailing duty applicable to PMI was 27.4% (the Reviewable Decision).

The decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 10 November 2017

The ADRP is satisfied that the following grounds are reasonable grounds for the reviewable decision not being the correct or preferable decision:

- (a) PMI should have been selected for examination under s 269TACAA; and
- (b) The Minister should not have applied the residual exporter dumping and subsidy margins to PMI but should have ascertained individual dumping and subsidy margins for PMI with an ascertained export floor price.

The goods to which these applications relate are:

Aluminium extrusions produced via an extrusion process, of alloys having metallic elements falling within the alloy designations published by The Aluminium Association commencing with 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7 (or proprietary or other certifying body equivalents), with the finish being as extruded (mill), mechanical, anodized or painted or otherwise coated, whether or not worked, having a wall thickness or diameter greater than 0.5 mm., with a maximum weight per metre of 27 kilograms and a profile or cross-section which fits within a circle having a diameter of 421 mm.

The ADRP proposes to conduct a review of the decision.

Interested parties have **30 days** from the date this notice is published to provide the ADRP with a submission.

If your submission contains confidential information, you must provide a public version that can be published on the ADRP website. Failure to do so will result in your submission not being considered.
