Notice under section 269ZZM(4)

Certain Aluminium Zinc Coated Steel exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of a decision by the former Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Jobs and Innovation to vary the variable factors in respect of the dumping duty notice applying to Certain Aluminium Zinc Coated Steel exported from the People's Republic of China by Baoshan Iron & Steel Co., Ltd and Shanghai Meishan Iron & Steel Co., Ltd (the Reviewable Decision). The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission's (ADC) website on 30 April 2018 (ADN 2018/54).

Applications for review were made by:

- Baoshan Iron & Steel Co., Ltd; and
- Shanghai Meishan Iron & Steel Co., Ltd.

The ADRP has recommended that I **affirm** the reviewable decision.

I, KAREN ANDREWS, Minister for Industry, Science and Technology have considered and accepted the recommendations, and reasons for the recommendations, made by the ADRP in ADRP Report No 87, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in ADRP Report No 87.

Therefore, in accordance with section 269ZZM(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901*, I **affirm** the reviewable decision.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Federal Court of Australia, in accordance with the requirements in the Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977, within 28 days of the publication of this notice.
