Notice under section 269ZZI

Certain Hollow Structural Sections exported from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia and Taiwan

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has received applications for review of a decision (Reviewable Decision) by the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Jobs and Innovation (Parliamentary Secretary) following a review of anti-dumping measures applying to Certain Hollow Structural Sections exported from the People's Republic of China, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia and Taiwan (Reviewable Decision).

Applications were received from:

- Tianjin Youfa Steel Pipe Group Co., Ltd (Tianjin Youfa);
- Dalian Steelforce Hi-Tech Co., Ltd (Dalian Steelforce); and
- Ursine Steel Co., Ltd (Ursine Steel).

The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 6 June 2018 ([ADN 2018/74](#)).

The ADRP is satisfied that the following grounds are reasonable grounds for the reviewable decision not being the correct or preferable decision:

Tianjin Youfa

1. The ADC should have included in its profit calculation, only the profit derived from entities within the Tianjin Youfa group of companies that sold, on their domestic market, like goods to those exported to Australia; and
2. The ADC failed to give adequate consideration of, and weight to, Tianjin Youfa's use of "narrow strip" in calculating the uplift cost of Hot Rolled Coil raw material inputs used in the production of the goods exported to Australia.

Dalian Steelforce

1. The Minister erred in determining profit by relying on Dalian Steelforce sales to the [REDACTED] Free Trade Zone (FTZ) which were not sold for home consumption in China;
2. The Minister erred in determining profit by relying on Dalian Steelforce sales to the FTZ which were not sales made in the ordinary course of trade; and
3. The Minister erred by not making necessary adjustments to ensure that export prices and normal values were compared at the same time.

Ursine Steel

1. The Minister erred in determining normal values using domestic sales which were not the most comparable like goods to the exported goods;

2. The Minister erred in determining the incorrect date of sale of the exported goods; and
3. The Minister erred in determining and applying a specification adjustment to the normal values.

The goods to which this review relates are:

certain electric resistance welded pipe and tube made of carbon steel, comprising circular and non-circular hollow sections in galvanised and non-galvanised finishes. The goods are normally referred to as either CHS (circular hollow sections) or RHS (rectangular or square hollow sections). The goods are collectively referred to as HSS (hollow structural sections). Finish types for the goods include in-line galvanised (ILG), pre-galvanised or hot-dipped galvanised (HDG) and non-galvanised HSS.

Sizes of the goods are, for circular products, those –exceeding 21 mm up to and including 165.1 mm in outside diameter and, for oval, square and rectangular products those with a perimeter up to and including 1277.3 mm. Categories of HSS excluded from the goods are conveyor tube; precision RHS with a nominal thickness of less than 1.6 mm; and air heater tubes to Australian Standard (AS) 2556.

Interested parties have **30 days** from the date this notice is published to provide the ADRP with a submission.

If your submission contains confidential information, you must provide a public version that can be published on the ADRP website. Failure to do so will result in your submission not being considered.
