## Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed the review of a decision which I, KAREN ANDREWS, Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, made under subsection 269ZDB(1)(a)(iii) of the *Customs Act 1901* in respect of Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from the People's Republic of China (Reviewable Decision). The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 9 May 2019 (ADN 2019/44).

Applications for review of the Reviewable Decision were made by Darley Aluminium Trading Pty Ltd, Fujian Minfa Aluminium Inc. (Fujian), Tai Shan City Kam Kiu Aluminium Extrusion Co., Ltd (Kam Kiu) and PanAsia Aluminium (China) Limited (PanAsia). On 23 August 2019, the ADRP made its report to me (ADRP Report No. 104). A copy of this report is available on the ADRP website. Any confidential information contained in ADRP Report No. 104 has been removed from the version available on the ADRP website. If your confidential information forms part of ADRP Report No. 104, you can request a copy of your confidential information from the ADRP Secretariat via the details available on the ADRP website.

The ADRP has recommended that the Reviewable Decision be:

- **revoked** as it relates to Guangdong Zhongya Aluminium Company Ltd (Zhongya) and substituted with a decision that the Countervailing Duty Notice is revoked with respect Zhongya;
- **revoked** as it relates to Kam Kiu and PanAsia, and substituted with a new decision setting a different normal value for each, reducing the dumping margin for Kam Kiu from 35.7 per cent to 13 per cent and for PanAsia from 55.2 per cent to 50.2 per cent; and
- **affirmed** as it relates to Fujian Minfa Aluminium Inc.

I, KAREN ANDREWS, Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, have considered and accepted the recommendations, and reasons for the recommendations, made by the ADRP in ADRP Report No. 104, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in ADRP Report No. 104.

Therefore, in accordance with section 269ZZM(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901*, I KAREN ANDREWS, Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, revoke the Reviewable Decision in so far as it relates to Zhongya, Kam Kiu and PanAsia and substitute a new decision as recommended by the ADRP. The substituted decision is to have effect from the date of the Reviewable Decision, being 9 May 2019.

Applications for review of this decision under the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act* 1977 should be made to the Federal Court of Australia within 28 days of:

- if you obtain a copy of your confidential information forming part of ADRP Report No. 104 receipt of that confidential information, or
- otherwise the publication of this notice.
