Notice under section 269ZZM(1B)

**Reconsideration of Certain Hollow Structural Sections exported from the People's
Republic of China by Tianjin Youfa Steel Pipe Group Co Ltd**

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed its reconsideration of a decision made by the then Assistant Minister for Science, Jobs and Innovation under subsection 269ZDB(1)(a)(iii) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of Certain Hollow Structural Sections exported from the People's Republic of China (China), the Republic of Korea, Malaysia and Taiwan (the Reviewable Decision). The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 6 June 2018 (ADN 2018/74).

The reconsideration of the Reviewable Decision related to Certain Hollow Structural Sections exported from China by Tianjin Youfa Steel Pipe Group Co Ltd.

On 9 March 2021, the then Minister for Industry, Science and Technology received the report by the ADRP. On 30 March 2021, I was sworn in as the new Minister for Industry, Science and Technology. Subsection 269ZZM(1A) of the Act requires that I must make a decision within 30 days after receiving the ADRP's report, unless I consider special circumstances prevent my decision being made within that period. If I do consider that such special circumstances exist, the decision may be made within such longer period as I consider appropriate.

I am satisfied that there are special circumstances that prevent my decision under section 269ZZM(1) being made within 30 days. Accordingly, I have decided under section 269ZZM(1A)(b) of the Act to extend the period for making my decision to 22 April 2021.
