**Aluminium Micro-Extrusions exported from the People's Republic of
China**

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (Review Panel) received an application from Aluminium Shapemakers Pty Ltd seeking a review of a decision by the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) to terminate Investigation No. 542 in accordance with section 269TDA(1)(b)(i) of the *Customs Act 1901* (Act) in respect of aluminium micro-extrusions exported from the People's Republic of China (China) by Guangdong Jiangsheng Aluminium Co Ltd and Guangdong Zhongya Aluminium Co Ltd (the Reviewable Decision).

The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 17 March 2021 (ADN 2021/38).

The Review Panel is satisfied that the following ground is a reasonable ground for the Reviewable Decision not being the correct or preferable decision: The normal value of the exports was determined under s.269TAC(2)(c) whereas it should have been determined under s.269TAC(6).

The Review Panel proposes to conduct a review of the Reviewable Decision in relation to the above ground.

The goods to which these applications relate are:

Aluminium micro-extrusions, in the form of hollow profiles, weighing less than 200 grams per metre (<0.2kg/m) in length, whether or not alloyed, mill finish, powder coated, anodised, or further coated.
