Notice under section 269ZZM(1B)

**Grinding Balls exported from the People's Republic of China**

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of a decision by the then Minister for Industry, Science and Technology made under subsection 269ZHG(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of Grinding Balls exported from the People's Republic of China (the Reviewable Decision). The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 8 September 2021 (ADN 2021/095).

On 24 December 2021, the ADRP made its report to me in accordance with section 269ZZK(3)(b)(i) of the Act. Subsection 269ZZM(1A) of the Act requires that I make a decision within 30 days after receiving that report, unless I consider special circumstances prevent my decision being made within that period. If I do consider that such special circumstances exist, the decision may be made within such longer period as I consider appropriate.

I am satisfied that there are special circumstances that prevent a decision under section 269ZZM(1) being made within 30 days and that it is appropriate to extend the time for making the decision to 28 February 2022.

Accordingly, I have decided under section 269ZZM(1A)(b) of the Act to extend the period for making my decision to 28 February 2022.
