**ADRP Review No. 141 – Grinding Balls exported from the People’s Republic of China**

Please be advised that the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (Review Panel) has initiated a review of the decision by the then Minister for Industry, Science and Technology, made under subsection 269ZHG(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of Grinding Balls exported from the People’s Republic of China (the Reviewable Decision). The review was initiated on 25 October 2021.

Applications for review of the Reviewable Decision were made on behalf of:

- Jiangyin Xingcheng Magotteaux Steel Balls Co Ltd;
- Changshu Longte Grinding Ball Co., Ltd; and
- Compañía Electro Metalúrgica S.A.

For the purpose of obtaining the relevant information in relation to this review, the Review Panel requests the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) provide the following documents:

1. Any confidential attachments to the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) relevant to the grounds of the review application (assuming the SEF will otherwise be on the public record)
2. Any parties’ submissions to the ADC commenting on the SEF, including confidential attachments relevant to the grounds of the application for review
3. Any confidential attachments to the Final Report (assuming the full Final Report will otherwise be on the public record)

4. Any other *relevant information* (as defined in s.269ZZK of the *Act*) pertinent to the grounds of review raised by the Applicant, for example:
  - If the grounds relate to normal value, please provide the relevant exporter visit reports/verification report, plus any confidential information/spreadsheets sent to the exporter regarding the calculation of the normal value, export price and dumping margins; and
  - If the grounds relate to subsidy levels, please provide any confidential information/spreadsheets sent to the relevant exporter regarding the calculation of subsidy and countervailing margins. A copy of information about the subsidy (ie any documents establishing the terms of and eligibility for the subsidy) should be provided.
  - If grounds relate to material injury/causal link please provide the verification visit report of the Australian industry and any confidential attachments.
  - Any relevant information regarding the analysis of the benchmark used for the purposes of determination of the normal value.
5. Any other documents that contain information about the Minister's decision on the continuation as published in ADN 2021/95 and the document titled 'Reasons for decision on Continuation Inquiry No 569.
