Notice under section 269ZZM(1B)

Grinding Balls exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (Review Panel) has completed a review of a decision by the former Minister for Industry, Science and Technology made under subsection 269ZHG(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of Grinding Balls exported from the People's Republic of China (the Reviewable Decision). The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 8 September 2021 (ADN 2021/095).

On 24 December 2021, the Review Panel made its report to the former Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction in accordance with section 269ZZK(3)(b)(ii) of the Act. On 19 January 2022, the former Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction extended the period of time to make a decision on the ADRP's report by 30 days due to special circumstances. On 28 February 2022, the former Minister for Industry, Energy and Emissions Reduction extended the period of time to make a decision by six months due to special circumstances. On 29 August 2022, I extended the period of time to make a decision on the ADRP's report by 28 days due to special circumstances. On 26 September 2022, I extended the period of time to make a decision by 30 days due to special circumstances. On 24 October 2022, I extended the period of time to make a decision by 30 days due to special circumstances.

My decision in relation to the ADRP's report is due by 25 November 2022. However, I am satisfied that there are special circumstances that prevent a decision under section 269ZZM(1) being made by 25 November 2022 and that it is appropriate to further extend the time for making the decision to 24 April 2023.

Accordingly, I have decided under section 269ZZM(1A)(b) of the Act to extend the period for making my decision to 24 April 2023.
