ADRP Review No. 156 – Hollow structural sections exported from the People’s Republic of China, the Republic of Korea, Malaysia and Taiwan

Please be advised that the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (Review Panel) has initiated a review of the decision made by the Minister for Industry and Science to:

- secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures applying to Hollow Structural Sections exported from the People’s Republic of China, Korea, Malaysia and Taiwan pursuant to s.269ZHG(1)(b) of the *Custom Act 1901* (“the Act”); and
- in accordance with s.269ZHG(4)(a)(ii) of the Act, determine that the dumping duty notice cease to apply to Hi-Steel Co., Ltd (“Hi-Steel”) (“Reviewable Decision”).

The applicants have sought review of the Reviewable Decision in so far as it relates to the decision under s.269ZHG(4)(a)(ii), relating to Hi-Steel, as set out below. The review was initiated on 1 September 2022. Applications for review of the Reviewable Decision were made by:

- Austube Mills Pty Ltd; and
- Orrcon Manufacturing Pty Ltd.

For the purpose of obtaining the relevant information in relation to this review, the Review Panel requests the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) provide the following documents:

1. Any confidential attachments to the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) relevant to the grounds of the applications for review (assuming the SEF will otherwise be on the public record);
2. Any parties' submissions to the ADC commenting on the SEF, including confidential attachments relevant to the grounds of the applications for review;
3. Any confidential attachments to the Final Report (assuming the full Final Report will otherwise be on the public record);
4. Any other *relevant information* (as defined in s269ZZK *Customs Act 1901*) pertinent to the grounds of review raised by the Applicants, for example:
 - If grounds relate to unsuppressed selling price/non-injurious price please provide the verification visit report of the Australian industry and any confidential attachments or the confidential information used to determine the non-injurious price.
 - If the grounds relate to normal value, please provide the relevant exporter visit reports, plus any confidential information/spreadsheets sent to the exporter regarding the calculation of the normal value, export price and dumping margins.
 - If the grounds relate to export price please provide the exporter and importer visit reports and any confidential information/spreadsheets sent to the exporter and/or importer regarding dumping margins.
 - If grounds relate to material injury/causal link please provide the verification visit report of the Australian industry and any confidential attachments.
5. Any other records/documents that contain information about the verification report/s or the model matching for the purposes of the normal value assessment.
