Reconsideration of Anti-Dumping Review Panel Review 155 – Aluminium Extrusions exported from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam

On 20 November 2025, the Federal Court of Australia (the Court) ordered that the:

- ascertainment of the normal value and dumping margin for PMB Aluminium SDN BHD (PMBA) by the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) in Report 591 be set aside,
- recommendations of the Anti-Dumping Review Panel (Review Panel) contained in Report 155 be set aside, and Report 155 be quashed,
- decision of the former Minister for Industry and Science (former Minister), made on 14 December 2023 and published on 15 December 2023 be set aside.

The matter was remitted to the ADC for preparation of a report and the making of recommendations on only the normal value and dumping margin for PMBA according to law. Upon the provision of the ADC's report, the Review Panel is to prepare a report under s 269ZZK of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in response to Capral's application for review dated 12 July 2022. A copy of the Court's orders (NSD67/2024) is available on the Review Panel's website.

On 20 February 2026, the ADC provided its report to the Review Panel. Accordingly, the Review Panel has recommenced its review of the former Minister's decision made under s 269ZHG(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of aluminium extrusions exported from Malaysia and Vietnam (the Reviewable Decision). Notice of the Reviewable Decision was published on Anti-Dumping Commission's website (EPR 591) on 24 June 2022 ([ADN 2022/042](#) refers).

The Review Panel's reconsideration will be conducted in accordance with its powers as outlined in Division 9 of Part XVB (Review by the Review Panel) of the Act. The Review Panel's reconsideration will be referred to as Review 155A – Reconsideration of Aluminium Extrusions exported from Malaysia and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam.

Please note that for the purposes of the reconsideration:

- Conferences may be held in accordance with s 269ZZHA of the Act. A non-confidential summary of any conferences convened will be placed on the Review Panel's website.

- The Review Panel cannot:
 - Receive written submissions from interested parties under s 269ZZJ of the Act.
 - Request a reinvestigation under s 269ZZL of the Act.
- The Review Panel's report must be made to the Minister for Industry and Innovation (Minister) within 40 business days of publication of the ADC's reconsideration report.
- The Review Panel's report and the Minister's decision will be published on the Review Panel's website, after a decision is made.

The goods to which this review relates are:

Aluminium extrusions produced via an extrusion process, of alloys having metallic elements falling within the alloy designations published by The Aluminium Association commencing with 1, 2, 3, 5, 6 or 7 (or proprietary or other certifying body equivalents), with the finish being as extruded (mill), mechanical, anodized or painted or otherwise coated, whether or not worked, having a wall thickness or diameter greater than 0.5mm, with a maximum weight per metre of 27 kilograms and a profile or cross-section which fits within a circle having a diameter of 421mm.

The goods under consideration include aluminium extrusion products that have been further processed or fabricated to a limited extent, after aluminium has been extruded through a die. For example, aluminium extrusion products that have been painted, anodised, or otherwise coated, or worked (e.g. precision cut, machined, punched or drilled) fall within the scope of the goods.

The goods do not extend to intermediate or finished products that are processed or fabricated to such an extent that they no longer possess the nature and physical characteristics of an aluminium extrusion, but have become a different product.
