**Aluminium Extrusions exported from Malaysia and Socialist Republic of Vietnam**

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (Panel) has completed its reconsideration of a review of the former Minister for Industry and Science's decision (the Minister) made under subsection 269ZH(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* in respect of Aluminium Extrusions (the goods) exported from Malaysia and Vietnam (the Decision), following orders by the Federal Court of Australia.<sup>1</sup> The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 24 June 2022.<sup>2</sup>

An application for review of the Decision was made by Capral Limited (Capral) on 12 July 2022. A copy of the application is available on the Panel website. Review No 155 was initiated on 17 August 2022 and a report was made to the Minister on 19 September 2023 (Report No 155).

On 14 December 2023, the Minister accepted the Panel's recommendations in Report No 155 and revoked the Decision and substituted a new decision to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping measures applying to the goods exported from Malaysia and Vietnam.<sup>3</sup> On 23 January 2024, Press Metal Aluminium (Australia) Pty Ltd and PMB Aluminium Sdn Bhd (PMBA) jointly applied for judicial review of the Minister's decision. On 19 November 2025, the Federal Court of Australia by consent, made orders that set aside the Minister's decision; set aside the recommendation of the Panel and quashed Report No 155; and set aside the normal value and dumping margin for PMBA in Report 591.<sup>4</sup>

On 22 April 2026, the Panel made its reconsideration report to me (Report No 155A). A public version of Report No 155A is available on the Panel's website, with confidential information removed. Where confidential information of a party has been redacted, that party may request a copy of the report containing its confidential information from the Panel Secretariat using the contact details on the Panel's website.

In Report No 155A, the Panel recommended that the Decision be revoked and substituted with a new specified decision to secure the continuation of the anti-dumping applying to aluminium extrusions exported from Malaysia and Vietnam.

I, Senator the Hon Tim Ayres, Minister for Industry and Innovation and Minister for Science, have considered and accepted the recommendations, and reasons for the recommendations, made by the

Panel in Report No 155A, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in Report No 155A. I have also had regard to REP 591, to the extent that it was not set aside by the Federal Court of Australia,<sup>5</sup> and the ADC's reconsideration report dated 20 February 2026, in so far as it relates to PMBA's normal value and revised dumping margin.

Therefore, pursuant to section 269ZZM(1)(b) of the *Customs Act 1901*, I revoke the Decision and substitute a new decision consistent with the Panel's recommendation. In doing so, in so far as the variable factors are concerned, the substituted decision has effect as if different variable factors had been fixed as follows:

- For PMBA, as determined in ADC REP 591<sup>6</sup> and the ADC's report dated 20 February 2026, in so far as it relates to PMBA's revised normal value and dumping margin; and
- For all other exporters of the goods from Malaysia and Vietnam, as determined in ADC REP 591.

The decision takes effect from the date of publication of this notice.

Applications for review of this decision under the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977* should be made to the Federal Court of Australia within 28 days of:

- The publication of this notice and Report No 155A; or
- If the public version of Report No 155A contains any redactions to remove your confidential information, such later date on which you receive a copy of Report No 155A without your confidential information redacted.
