Reconsideration of Anti-Dumping Review Panel Review 160A
PVC Flat Electrical Cables exported from China by Guilin International Wire & Cable Co. Ltd ('the Reconsideration')

Following the decision of the Federal Court of Australia ('the Court') in the matter of *Electra Cables (Aust.) Pty Limited v Minister for Industry and Innovation* [2025] FCA 1677 ('*Electra Case 1*'), the Court in the matter of *Electra Cables (Aust.) Pty Limited v Minister for Industry and Innovation (No.2)* [2026] FCA 879 (*Electra Case 2*'), on 17 June 2026 ordered that the Minister's decision made on 30 September 2024, and the Anti-Dumping Review Panel's ('Review Panel') report ('Report 160A') made on 30 August 2024 in respect of the review concerning Anti-Dumping Notice 2022/019¹ be set aside in part and only to the extent provided for and necessary to give effect to the Court Orders. Electra Cables (Aust.) Pty Limited ('Electra') was the Applicant and the Review Panel was the Second Respondent in both *Electra Case 1* and *Electra Case 2*.

The matter has been remitted to the Review Panel for reconsideration, in accordance with the following Order 2:²

- a) for determination according to law of the following issue, together with the consequences for the outcome of the application for Review, namely the correct application of s 269TAF(1) of the Customs Act in respect of the conversion of the deductive export price from AUD to RMB in respect of goods exported by Guilin International Wire & Cable Co. Ltd, which conversion must use the exchange rates on the date of each of the transactions, being the individual invoice dates for each of the export consignments; and
- b) on the basis that the Review Panel's decision is made on remittal on the material that was previously before the Review Panel in making Review Panel Report 160A, save for such further material that the Review Panel requests as to the issue in Order 2(a).

Accordingly, the Review Panel has recommenced its review of the Minister's decision made under s 269TG of the Act in respect of PVC Flat Electrical Cables exported by Guilin from China,³ as ordered by the Court.

The Review Panel's reconsideration will be conducted in accordance with its powers under Division 9 of Part XVB of the Act. The reconsideration will be referred to as Review 160B – PVC Flat Electrical Cables exported from China by Guilin International Wire & Cable Co. Ltd.

Please note that for the purposes of the reconsideration:

- Conferences may be held in accordance with s 269ZZHA of the Act. A non-confidential summary of any conferences convened will be published on the Review Panel's website.
- The Review Panel cannot:
 - Receive written submissions from interested parties under s 269ZZJ of the Act; or
 - Request a reinvestigation under s 269ZZL of the Act.
- The Review Panel intends to make its report to the Minister by 6 October 2026.
- The Review Panel's report and the Minister's decision will be published on the Review Panel's website, after a decision is made.

The goods to which this Reconsideration relates are:

Flat, electric cables, comprising two copper conductor cores and an 'earth' (copper) core with a nominal conductor cross sectional area of between, and including, 2.5 mm² and 3 mm², insulated and sheathed with polyvinyl chloride (PVC) materials, and suitable for connection to mains electricity power installations at voltages exceeding 80 volts (V) but not exceeding 1,000 V, and complying with Australian/New Zealand Standard (AS/NZS) AS/NZS 5000.2 (the Australian Standard), and whether or not fitted with connectors.

The following products were excluded from the investigation:

- *Single core cables (cables with a single active core);*
- *Aerial cables as defined by the Australian Standard;*
- *Twin active flat cables (flat cables comprising two active cores but no earth core);*
- *Circular cables as defined by the Australian Standard;*
- *Cables insulated and/or sheathed with non-PVC material, including but not limited to cross-linked polyethylene (XPLE) materials, including a combination of PVC and non-PVC material;*
- *Cables comprising cores made of aluminium conductors; and*
- *Flexible cables (cords) as defined by AS/NZS 3191 and/or AS/NZS 60227.*

The goods are generally, but not exclusively, classified to tariff classification 8544.49.20 (statistical code 41) in Schedule 3 to the Customs Tariff Act 1995.
