Notice under section 269ZZI

Certain strata steel bolts exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (Review Panel) has received an application from ANTO Mining Equipment Co Ltd (ANTO) seeking review of the Minister for Industry and Innovation and Minister for Science's decision to publish a dumping duty notice under sections 269TG(1) and (2) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) for certain strata steel bolts (the goods) exported from the People's Republic of China (China) (the Reviewable Decision).

The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 1 June 2026 (ADN 2026/058 refers).

The Review Panel is satisfied that the following grounds are reasonable grounds for the Reviewable Decision not being the correct or preferable decision:¹

- 1) **Ground 1:** The Minister erred in determining constructed normal value for ANTO by calculation of profit for ANTO which was different to the calculation of the profit included in the constructed normal value for the only other two cooperative exporters, Sandvik Jining (Sandvik) and Huanghua Tanrimine (Tanrimine). Further, because ANTO was not aware of the error made in the ADC's calculations in the profit margin used for ANTO for the Preliminary Affirmative Determination and the Statement of Essential Facts, ANTO was deprived of the opportunity to make submissions and offer its data.
- 2) **Ground 2:** The Minister erred in determining constructed normal value for ANTO in undertaking calculations for ANTO that were incorrect.

The Review Panel proposes to conduct a review of the Reviewable Decision in relation to the above grounds.

The goods to which these applications relate are:

Certain strata reinforcing steel bolts, hollow, made from flat rolled steel, whether or not metallic coated (e.g. galvanised), whether or not containing alloys, with an outside diameter from 44 millimetres up to and including 48 millimetres, of a length from 2.2 metres up to and including 2.5 metres, of a base metal thickness from 2.8 millimetres up to and including 3.4 millimetres, whether or not including the welded ring.

¹ During a conference under section 269ZZHA of the Act, ANTO was provided with an opportunity to clarify its grounds of review following a written response by the ADC to further information requested by the Review Panel. ANTO provided a written response dated 13 August 2026 clarifying its grounds.

Submissions

Interested parties have **30 days** after the date on which this notice is published to provide the Review Panel with a submission. Your submission should indicate your eligibility to make a submission as either an interested party to the Reviewable Decision or as one of the specified entities under section 269ZZJ of the Act.

If your submission contains confidential information, you must provide a public version that can be published on the Review Panel website. Failure to do so will result in your submission not being considered. All information that is confidential or commercially sensitive must be highlighted in yellow in the confidential version of your submission.
