ZINC COATED (GALVANISED) STEEL AND ALUMINIUM ZINC COATED STEEL Exported from the People's Republic of China LONGER PERIOD FOR DECISION

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of a decision by the then Attorney-General to publish dumping duty notices and countervailing duty notices in relation to Zinc Coated (Galvanised) Steel and Aluminium Zinc Coated Steel exported from the People's Republic of China.

The application for review was made by the Ministry of Commerce of the People's Republic of China. A copy of the application and is available on the ADRP website www.adreviewpanel.gov.au

The ADRP provided its report and recommendation to me on 19 November 2013. Subsection 269ZZM(1A) of the *Customs Act 1901* requires that I must make a decision in regard to that report and its recommendation within 30 days of receiving that report or where I consider special circumstances prevent that decision being made with that period – such longer period as I consider appropriate. This required me to make my decision by 19 December 2013.

Due to special circumstances involved in making this decision I consider that in order to properly consider the report and its recommendations I will not be able to provide the decision within the prescribed period. Such special circumstances include:

- the complicated nature of this decision and the issues involved; and
- the need to seek further relevant information.

Accordingly, I extend the period in which my decision must be made so that it ends on 14 February 2014.
