Notice under section 269ZZM (4)

Consumer Pineapple Exported from Thailand By Thai Pineapple Canning Industry Corp Ltd

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of a decision by the then Minister for Home Affairs to amend anti-dumping measures applicable to consumer pineapple products exported from Thailand. The then Minister's decision was published on 26 July 2013. In making that decision, the then Minister refused an application by SIAM AGRO-FOOD Industry Public Company Limited (SIAM) to revoke a dumping duty notice in respect of consumer pineapple exported from Thailand by Thai Pineapple Canning Industry Corp Ltd (TPC), a subsidiary of SIAM.

The application for review was made by SIAM. A copy of the application and the ADRP Report to me is available on the ADRP website www.adreviewpanel.gov.au

The ADRP recommended that I revoke the anti-dumping measures for consumer pineapple exported to Australia from Thailand by TPC.

I, BOB BALDWIN, Minister for Industry, have considered and accepted that recommendation, and the reasons for that recommendation including all material findings of fact or law relating to that recommendation as set out in the ADRP Report. Therefore, with effect from the date of this notice, I REVOKE the dumping duty notice applicable to consumer pineapple exported to Australia from Thailand by TPC under subsection 269ZZM(1) of the *Customs Act 1901*. (Anti-dumping measures applying to consumer pineapple exported to Australia from Thailand by other exporters are not affected by this decision and will continue.)

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Federal Court of Australia, in accordance with the requirements in the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977*, within 28 days of the publication of this notice.
