CERTAIN ALUMINIUM EXTRUSIONS Exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of a decision by the Minister for Industry and Science to vary a dumping duty notice and countervailing duty notice in respect of Certain Aluminium Extrusions exported from the People's Republic of China. The decision of the Minister was published in the Australian newspaper on 19 February 2015 (the Reviewable Decision).

The applications for review were made by Capral Limited, Opal (Macao Offshore Commercial) Limited and PanAsia Aluminium (China) Limited. A copy of the applications and the ADRP Report to me is available on the ADRP website <u>www.adreviewpanel.gov.au.</u>

The ADRP has recommended that I affirm the Reviewable Decision.

I, KAREN ANDREWS, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry and Science, have considered the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations made by the member of the ADRP, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in ADRP Report No. 21. In accordance with section 269ZZM(1)(a) of the *Customs Act 1901* I **affirm** the reviewable decision. My decision has effect from the date of this notice.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Federal Court of Australia, in accordance with the requirements in the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977,* within 28 days of the publication of this notice.
