Notice under section 269ZZM (4)

Hollow Structural Sections Containing other alloys exported from the People's Republic of China, Republic of Korea and Malaysia

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of a decision by the former Assistant Minister for Science and the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science to publish a notice under section 269ZDBH(1) of the *Customs Act 1901*. The former Parliamentary Secretary's decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (the ADC) website on 18 March 2016 (the Reviewable Decision).

Applications for review were made by Atpac Group Pty Ltd, GP Marketing International Pty Ltd, Steelforce Trading Pty Ltd, Steelforce Australia Pty Ltd and Dalian Steelforce Hi-Tech Co Ltd (collectively "Steelforce"), and Austube Mills Pty Ltd (Administrator appointed). A copy of the applications and the ADRP's report to me (ADRP Report No 37) is available on the ADRP website www.adreviewpanel.gov.au.

The ADRP has recommended that I affirm the reviewable decision.

I, CRAIG LAUNDY, Assistant Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry, Innovation and Science, have considered and accept the recommendations and reasons for the recommendations made by the ADRP, including all material findings of fact or law as set out in ADRP Report No 37.

Therefore, in accordance with section 269ZZM(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* I **affirm** the Reviewable Decision.

Interested parties may seek a review of this decision by lodging an application with the Federal Court of Australia, in accordance with the requirements in the *Administrative Decisions (Judicial Review) Act 1977*, within 28 days of the publication of this notice.
