## Chrome-Plated Steel Bar exported from the Italian Republic and Romania

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) received an application from Milltech Pty Ltd dated 2 September 2016 for review of a decision ("Reviewable Decision") by the Commissioner of the Anti-Dumping Commission to terminate that part of Investigation 319 as it related to the alleged dumping of certain Chrome-plated steel bar by Stelmi S.p.A ("Stelmi") from the Italian Republic (Italy). The investigation was terminated under s 269TDA(1) and s 269TDA(3).

The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 3 August 2016 (ADN 2016/69).

The ADRP is satisfied that the following grounds are reasonable grounds for the Reviewable Decision not being the correct or preferable decision which are as follows:

- 1. The export price was not determined in accordance with s 269TAB(1)(a);
- 2. The normal value was not calculated in accordance with the Act and was incorrectly calculated; and
- The difference between the dumping margin for products exported by Stelmi and those exported by Cromsteel NV compared to the market situation in Australia of products exported by those countries show that the dumping margin adopted for Stelmi by the Commission was wrong.

The goods to which this review relates to are:

Chromium plated circular solid steel bars (chrome bars) that have all of the following characteristics:

- circular cross section;
- made from alloy or non-alloy steel;
- chrome plating of any thickness;
- lengths of not greater than 8 metres; and
- diameters in the range 18mm to 170mm.

## but excluding:

- chromium plated steel bars with oval or flattened circle cross sections; and
- hollow or tubular chrome plated bars.

The ADRP proposes to conduct a review of the Reviewable Decision.
