Notice under section 269ZZM(1B)

Grinding Balls exported from the People's Republic of China

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of a decision by the then Minister for Industry, Science and Technology made under subsection 269ZHG(1) of the *Customs Act 1901* (the Act) in respect of Grinding Balls exported from the People's Republic of China (the Reviewable Decision). The Reviewable Decision was published on the Anti-Dumping Commission (ADC) website on 8 September 2021 (ADN 2021/095).

On 24 December 2021, the ADRP made its report to me in accordance with subparagraph 269ZZK(3)(b)(i) of the Act. Subsection 269ZZM(1A) of the Act requires that I make a decision within 30 days after receiving that report, unless I consider special circumstances prevent my decision being made within that period. If I do consider that such special circumstances exist, the decision may be made within such longer period as I consider appropriate.

On 19 January 2022, I extended the period of time to make my decision by 30 days due to special circumstances. My decision in relation to the ADRP's report is currently due by 28 February 2022. However, I am satisfied that there are special circumstances that prevent a decision under subsection 269ZZM(1) being made by 28 February 2022 and that it is appropriate to further extend the time for making the decision by six months.

The special circumstances are that the matters are complex and require further consideration.

Accordingly, I have decided under paragraph 269ZZM(1A)(b) of the Act to extend the period for making my decision to 27 August 2022.
