WIND TOWERS Exported from the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Korea

The Anti-Dumping Review Panel (ADRP) has completed a review of a decision by the Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry to impose dumping duties with respect to Wind Towers exported from the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Korea. The Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Industry's decision was published in the Australian on 16 April 2014.

The applications for review were made by Senvion Systems SE, Senvion Australia Pty Ltd (collectively Senvion) and Win&P., Ltd. A copy of the applications and the ADRP Recommendation Report to me is available on the ADRP website www.adreviewpanel.gov.au

The ADRP has recommended that I affirm the reviewable decision.
