Description: The Hunter Power Project is a greenfield open cycle gas-fired power station and electrical switchyard that will have the capacity to generate 660 megawatts of electricity to ensure energy security as part of the National Energy Market. The Project is located at Loxford, near Kurri Kurri in NSW. Procurement first began in 2021 and the procurement of key goods and services has since concluded. Construction began in around March 2022 and the project is now in final stages of commissioning. The Australian Government is the sole shareholder of Snowy Hydro and the project was partially funded by way of an equity subscription agreement.
