Purpose: Establish new facility

Description: Goombi Renewable Energy Hub (The Project) is seeking to develop an up to 800 megawatts (MW) wind farm, comprising up to 107 wind turbine generators (WTGs) each with a nameplate generation capacity of 4.5–8.0 MW (final turbine model to be determined). The Project also includes an up to 800 MW/3,200 megawatt hours (MWh) battery energy storage systems (BESS), up to four wind monitoring masts, dedicated substations and other supporting ancillary infrastructure to support both construction and operation. The Project will connect into existing Powerlink transmission lines traversing the Project Area. Once operational, the Project is expected to power around 400,000 households, supporting the advancement of Queensland's renewable energy transition and avoiding 1.6 million tonnes of carbon emissions each operational year. High level timeline: - preferred Wind Turbine Manufacturer selected: Q1 2027 - shortlisted Balance of Plan Contractor selected: Q4 2027 - commencement of construction: Q2 2028 - commencement of operations: 2030 There are currently no Australian Government funding, grant or investment for the project.
