Description of the Facility:

The Eliwana Mine will be a new mine with associated infrastructure at the Operator's Eliwana Site.

The planned infrastructure includes 143km of rail and a 30 million tonne per annum dry ore processing facility. Board approval for the Project was achieved in May 2018, and first ore on train is expected in December 2020.

Western Hamersley Ranges, ~90km west of the town of Tom Price, Western Australia.
