Description of the Project:

The Eliwana Project is for the development of a new mine and associated infrastructure at the Proponent's Eliwana Site.

The planned infrastructure includes 143km of rail and a 30 million tonne per annum dry ore processing facility. Board approval for the Project was achieved in May 2018, and first ore on train is expected in December 2020.

ICNWA

The Proponent will engage ICNWA to:

- provide feedback to Australian entities who are not shortlisted to participate in the tender process which may include recommendations on development activities to increase capability and capacity.

The Project’s major contractors will be informed of the Proponent’s AIP Plan requirements early in the tender process and required under their contracts with the Proponent to provide Australian entities with full, fair and reasonable opportunity to bid for the supply goods or services for the Project and report to the Proponent on its compliance.

Major contractors will be required to comply with the Proponent’s AIP Plan.
