#### 1. Organisation and project details

**Description of the project:** The project will construct and fit out a Regional Aquatic, and Arts and Leisure Precinct, including:

- 25 metre 8 lane pool with ramp access;
- 10 metre warm water therapy pool and spa;
- freeform indoor leisure pool that includes learn-to-swim and toddler areas;
- · water play splash pad and waterslides;
- gymnasium, group fitness and wellness area;
- · foyer, café and visitor information;
- flat floor 350 seat auditorium;
- · gallery and exhibition space; and
- · rehearsal areas, workshops and meeting rooms.

Construction is estimated to commence in early 2020 with an estimated completion date of September 2021.

Procurement opportunities are estimated to commence in late 2019 through until August 2021.
