This is to certify that the pattern and variants of the weight described in this Certificate have been examined by the National Standards Commission under the provisions of the abovementioned Regulations and have been approved as being suitable for use for trade.

Approval of the pattern and all variants, except those of 5 kg, 10 kg and 20 kg denomination (of rectangular shape) was granted on 12th December, 1967. Approval of variants of 5 kg, 10 kg and 20 kg denomination of rectangular shape was granted on 31st August, 1971. Further variants were approved on 25th February, 1972. Approval of variants relating to apothecaries weights, troy weights and wire weights was withdrawn on 25th February, 1972.

Description of Pattern. The pattern is of a 1 kilogram regular hexagonal weight as described in the General Specifications for Measuring Instruments to be Used for Trade.

Description of Variants. In other shapes and denominations as described in the General Specifications.
